Registration Package Camper

This registration package contains the forms and information necessary to enroll in the Deaf Camp for 2022 and can be used as a checklist to ensure everything we need is submitted.

Camper Application. This is an on-line fill-in form. If not already completed, go to: lionswildcamp.org/applications and select **Online Camper Application**. Enter as much information as possible so the camper can be placed as appropriate for the staff and the camper. When complete, you will be returned to the website to complete this checklist.

Health History Form. This is an on-line fill-in form. If not already completed, go to: lionswildcamp.org/applications and select **Online Camper Medical Form**. Enter as much information as possible so the camper can be assured proper medical attention at camp. When complete, you will be returned to the website to complete this checklist. **Without exception, campers will NOT be allowed to remain at camp without a Health History Form completed by the parent or guardian and proof of COVID vaccination or Neg COVID test within 72 hours of camp.**

Bring copy of Medical ID card to camp registration or send with Agreement form below.

Camper/Parent Agreement Form: This is a fill-in PDF form attached with this checklist. Navigate using the tab key and "enter" to place checkmarks. Please use a separate form for each child. All information must be supplied.

Camper must sign.

Parent / Guardian must sign.

If **ANYONE** other than signer will pick up child, ensure his or her name is on this form.

Submit No later than 3 July (South Camp) or 24 July (North Camp). If not submitted by due date, application will be rejected. Use one of the formats below:

Camp is a very exciting and adventurous time. It can also be stressful getting used to living with 8 to 10 other people in a cabin and being away from home. Lions Wilderness Camp for Deaf Children Inc. (LWC) is concerned that care and attention is given to ALL campers as equitably as possible. We work to minimize discipline problems and handle them individually. Your support will help us have a safe and fun time. We ask that both the camper and the parents or guardian read and sign the following together:

Coronavirus / COVID-19 Warning & Disclaimer

Coronavirus, COVID-19 is an extremely contagious virus that spreads easily through person-to-person contact. Federal and state authorities recommend social distancing as a means to prevent the spread of the virus. COVID-19 can lead to severe illness, personal injury, permanent disability, and death. Participating in LWC programs or accessing LWC facilities could increase the risk of contracting COVID-19. LWC in no way warrants that COVID-19 infection will not occur through participation in LWC programs or accessing LWC facilities.

As the camper I AGREE TO abide by the following camp rules at all times:

1. The camper will be considerate of the safety and feelings of others and care for the camp property.
2. If the camper willfully and repeatedly disobeys the rules, he or she will be sent home. The parents or guardian will be notified to come to the camp and take the camper home.
3. The possession of any illegal substance (drugs, marijuana, etc.), alcohol, weapons, or other items deemed inappropriate by the Camp Program Director will be grounds for dismissal and the parents or guardian will be contacted to take the camper home.
4. Payment for any damage done to camp property or property of others as a direct result of the camper's behavior will be paid for by the parents or guardian when the child is picked up.

As the responsible Parent or Guardian:

1. I state that the information on the online application and the online Medical Information Form is accurate to the best of my knowledge, that unless previously indicated, my child is Deaf or Hard of Hearing, and I assume all responsibility for the information given.
2. I fully understand that after reasonable precautions are taken, there are certain hazards connected with the camp environment, and I release the LWC, and its Directors, Agents, and Employees from liability connected with camp activities including loss of clothing and personal items.
3. I understand LWC does not provide health or accident insurance for campers and that I am responsible for expenses associated with medical evaluation, treatment and transportation made on my behalf.
4. Pictures will be taken at the camp for display at the camp; on the appropriate LWC websites; and in camp promotional materials. I approve having pictures taken of my child: **Yes** **No** (except group photo)
5. I authorize my child to be transported in rental and/or private vehicles, as the need arises, to locations off-site for Wilderness Camp activities.

13. MAP 1.

CAMP TERESITA PINES, 22801 BIG PINES HWY: From LA: Route A:

Take I-5 north to 14. Take 14 (north) to 138 (east) *to N4 (Largo Vista – mile marker #68). Go up the hill and at the stop sign turn left and continue on N4. Proceed 3 miles. Camp is less than 1/4 mile past Jackson Lake on the left. (This is a better route than the Angeles Crest Hwy.)

Route B: Take 15 (north) to 138 to Hwy. 2. Proceed through Wrightwood towards the Big Pines Ranger Station, past Mtn. High Ski area. At the 3-way fork take N4 down (right) 2 1/2 miles to camp on the right.

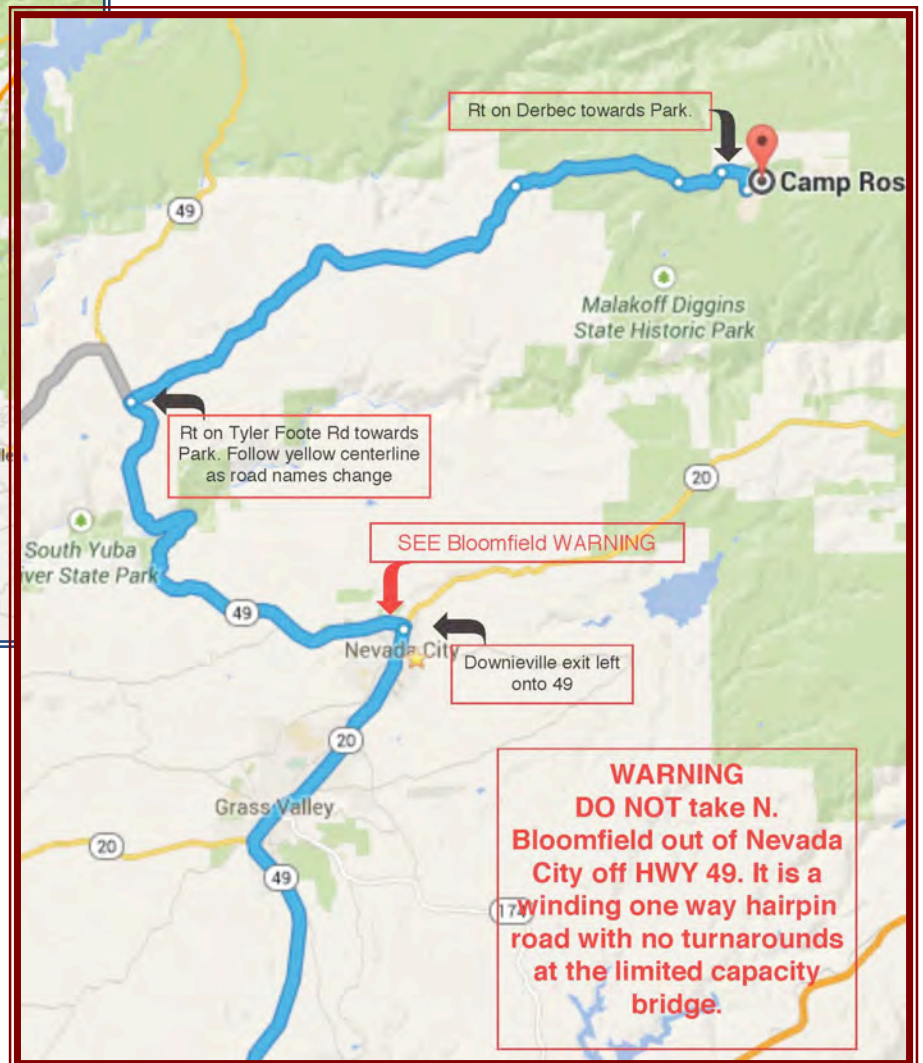
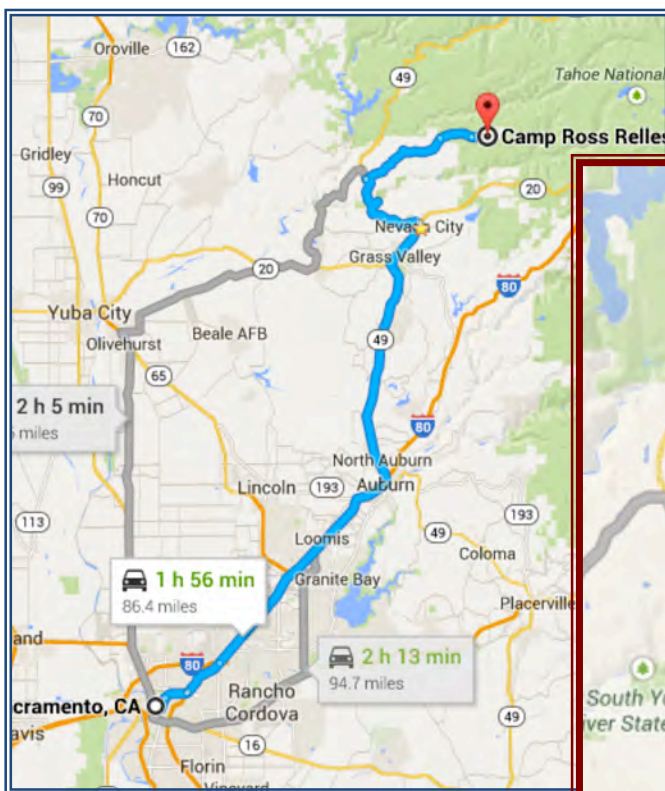
From the North take I-5 or 99 to Bakersfield, then 138 (east) through Tehachapi and Mojave to Hwy. 14. Take 14 south to Ave. S in Palmdale. Go north on Ave. S to 147th and back onto 138 to Pearblossom. Continue through Pearblossom and follow Route A above from *.



DIRECTIONS TO THE LIONS CAMP AT ROSS RELLES NEXT TO MALAKOFF DIGGINS

DO NOT USE MAPQUEST or GPS directions; they use bumpy, winding dirt roads.

From the intersection of Highway 80 and Highway 49 in Auburn, go north (left at the light after you take the 49 turnoff) on Highway 49 through Auburn, on to Grass Valley (about 25 miles from the 80/49 intersection; WARNING—the 55 MPH speed limit above Auburn and the headlight requirement from Dry Creek Road just north of Auburn to south Grass Valley are strictly enforced by CHP), then on to Nevada City. Just above Nevada City, Highway 49 makes a left turn from a left turn lane. Take that turn. Go 10+ miles. There is a big sign on the right that says turn right to Malakoff Diggins State Park. Make that right turn onto Tyler Foote Road. Go 9+ miles to a point where Tyler Foote (Crossing Road) makes a 90 degree turn to the left. (FOLLOW THE YELLOW CENTER LINES) Go straight. The name of the road is now Cruzon Grade Road. Go just over 4 miles to Derbec Road. Turn right. Go about 3/4 of a mile, where Derbec Road T's into North Bloomfield Road. Turn left onto the dirt road. At about 4/10s of a mile, you will see a large Camp Sign on your right. STOP and wait at the service Road entrance that is at that sign. **Follow the Staff instructions for Camper Drop off and Pickup.**
